



What is the Smart Growth Partnership?

The Smart Growth Partnership is a public/private sector forum designed to promote better coordination between growth and the transportation system. The Partnership was formed based on recommendations from the 2002 Mobility 21 conference. This initiative brings together public and private sector leaders throughout Los Angeles County to address real implementation issues in working meetings. The group includes representatives from local, county and regional government, developers, consultants, bankers, school districts, universities, and land use and housing policy advocates.

Over the past year and a half, the Smart Growth Partnership held four forums to discuss growth challenges and their relationship to the transportation system. To focus on implementation issues, the Partnership initiated a pilot study looking at development challenges and opportunities at four promising locations near regional transit stations: the North Hollywood Metro Red Line Station, the Covina Metrolink Station, Hawthorne Blvd. near the Metro Green Line station and a segment of Wilshire Corridor located between the Westlake/MacArthur Park and Vermont Metro Red Line stations. The studies aimed to identify specific barriers to maximizing transit-supportive infill development and to formulate solutions.
