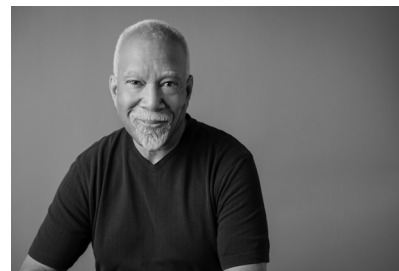

### California VMT Metrics and Mobility Solutions

Over the past decade, the State has implemented policies that aim to reduce the number of vehicle miles traveled (VMT) throughout California, in part, to reduce transportation sources of greenhouse gas emissions. Caltrans has now replaced Level of Service with VMT analysis for transportation-related impacts on highway projects. Views range widely on what analysis tools are appropriate to use in specific locations and on certain types of projects, many yielding a wide range of VMT results. For capacity-increasing projects, VMT impacts and the cost associated to mitigate them can be challenging to overcome.
